Abu Dhabi Mangrove Initiative — Blue Carbon Restoration & Monitoring Programme

Summary

Abu Dhabi's environment agency has planted tens of millions of mangroves since 2015, expanding cover to roughly 17,600 ha; EAD reports the emirate's blue-carbon ecosystems store about 41 million tonnes of carbon, backed by new national restoration guidelines.
