Summary

Jordan's Ministry of Education piloted Amira Learning's AI reading-tutor agent with Grade 4 and 7 students from January 2026 — 1:1 sessions 3–5x/week over 12 weeks with pre/post assessment — as a first step toward a possible national rollout to ~800,000 students.
