Summary

Since its 2021 launch, Brunei's Academy for Women Entrepreneurs — a U.S. State Department global model delivered locally by Darussalam Enterprise — has graduated 66 women through a DreamBuilder curriculum, with top graduates winning up to US\$3,000 in seed funding each cohort.
