

# African Girls Can Code Initiative Phase III — AI, Cybersecurity and Civic Tech Bootcamp at CEMASTEА, Kenya

## Summary

Phase III of the African Girls Can Code Initiative trained 100 young women (14-25) at Kenya's CEMASTEА centre in AI, cybersecurity, civic tech and the digital platform economy; 113 girls have taken part in Kenya since 2022, with some graduates hired by Siemens and Safaricom.
