Summary

Greece's Hellenic Cadastre became the first Greek public authority to use AI in administrative decision support, reading contracts and flagging missing legal elements for staff. Backlogs fell 80% in Athens and 90% in Thessaloniki as AI-assisted acts reached 310,000.
