Summary

A tripartite MOU signed in Feb 2023 by Madagascar's Ministry of Education, UNICEF and Airtel gave free access to a national digital-learning platform, starting with 14,000 students in 15 junior schools; by mid-2025 it had reached 86 schools, 51,000 students and 1,300 teachers.
