

ALCES — Algeria's AI-Assisted Customs Platform Processes 120,000 Declarations in Its First Nine Months

Summary

Algeria's customs authority launched ALCES, a clearance platform whose risk module uses AI to flag import/export fraud risk. It processed 120,000 declarations and registered 6,000+ operators in nine months, later expanding to travelers — but no fraud-catch rate is published.
