Summary

Since Executive Decree 20-254 (2020), Algeria's new Ministry of Knowledge Economy has labelled over 2,300 startups, built 104 support centres and 22 incubators, and capitalised an \$80m Algerian Startup Fund — though evidence so far is registration counts, not measured firm outcom
