Summary

REDD+ project protecting 182,000 ha of Amazonian forest in San Martín, Peru. Between 2008–2020: 59% deforestation decline, 8.4M tCO₂e prevented, 1,300+ conservation agreements with families, US\$45M carbon revenue. Verified under VCS and CCB by Verra.
