

Amara y Ullujalla — Peru's First Conservation Concession for a Fog-Oasis (Lomas) Ecosystem

Summary

In April 2024 Peru granted its first Concession for Conservation over a lomas fog-oasis: 6,449 hectares in Ica region, protected 30+ years after 15+ years of advocacy by a local NGO, Kew and a community farm. Only 4% of Peru and Chile's lomas are protected.
