Summary

Founded in Berlin in 2007, BAG TäHG unites 86 member facilities at 118 locations in Germany around shared standards for perpetrator work, implementing Istanbul Convention Article 16. A 161-participant study found completers had lower recidivism-risk indicators than dropouts.
