Summary

Since 2010, Reykjavik crowdsourcing platform registered 70,000+ participants (58 % of residents), collected 10,000+ ideas, realised nearly 700 citizen projects and allocates 450 million ISK (~3.5 M) annually — ~6 % of capital investment — through participatory budget votes.
