

Bishan–Ang Mo Kio Park — Kallang River Naturalisation under Singapore's ABC Waters Programme

Summary

PUB and NParks turned a 2.7 km concrete canal carrying the Kallang River into a 3 km naturalised, meandering river through Bishan–Ang Mo Kio Park (2007–2012), widened up to 5x and doubling as flood storage; PUB reports a 30% rise in biodiversity since completion.
