

Chile's Algorithmic Transparency Recommendations — Turning a National Algorithm Map into Binding Disclosure Rules

Summary

Chile's transparency regulator (CPLT) and GobLab UAI mapped 92 automated decision systems across 42 public bodies in 2021, and in August 2024 issued binding recommendations requiring disclosure of each algorithm's purpose, logic and data categories under the Transparency Law.
