Summary

Since 2018, UNHCR Jordan and Learning Equality, funded by Google.org, have run 10 offline Kolibri e-learning hubs — three inside the Zaatari and Azraq camps — giving refugee and host-community youth aged 13-17 daily access to core subjects without internet.
