

# Crossplag — Cross-Lingual Plagiarism and AI-Text Detection, from a Kosovo Startup to European Assessment Infrastructure

## Summary

Founded in Prishtina in 2016, Crossplag built one of the first detectors targeting cross-language ('translate-to-evade') plagiarism, reaching 5,000+ educators before being acquired by Norway's Inspera in 2023. Independent testing still finds AI-text detection broadly unreliable.
