

Cyprus's Public-Sector Web & App Accessibility Law — A Mandate Tested Against Measured Compliance

Summary

Cyprus's Law 50(I)/2019 requires public-sector websites and apps to meet EN 301 549/WCAG accessibility, with a Monitoring Committee - yet an independent IEEE evaluation of e-government sites found none error-free and only 15.71% of pages reaching acceptable compliance.
