Trinity College Dublin project Digi-ID PLUS built DigiAcademy, an e-learning platform teaching email, browsing and video-calling, co-designed and co-taught by adults with intellectual disabilities; 400+ people across Europe/UK took part, backed by EUR2.2m from EIT Health.
