

Dignity Kits for Menstrual Hygiene Management — UNICEF/UMCOR Response in Aweil, South Sudan

Summary

UNICEF and UMCOR distributed reusable dignity kits with menstrual supplies to 18,863 schoolgirls across 476 schools in Aweil, South Sudan, while a national WASH assessment of 4,159 schools found only 19% with working toilets had menstrual-hygiene facilities.
