

DIPC Digital Literacy Training for Frontline Immunization Officers

Digital Inclusion · Good practice · Sierra Leone

Quality score: 72/100

Evidence strength: Observational / pre–post

Summary

Blended digital-literacy training for 150 frontline immunization officers across 96 health centres in Sierra Leone raised computer-literacy proficiency from 9% to 81% and troubleshooting skills from 18% to 74% ($p<0.001$), enabling adoption of an electronic vaccine stock tool.
