eKitabu, a Nairobi edtech nonprofit, builds born-accessible e-books for blind/low-vision learners and Kenyan Sign Language video storybooks for deaf learners with Kenya's Ministry of Education. 160+ titles are in the Global Digital Library; a small 2022 pilot showed gains.
