Summary

Plan Vivo-certified agroforestry project run by Graine de Vie with Bankim, Banyo and Mayo-Darlé communes in Cameroon's Adamawa Region pays smallholders to plant native trees, sequestering an estimated 3,300 tCO₂e since 2024 while sharing carbon revenue with villages.
