

Fiji Forest Landscape Restoration (FP306) — A \$52.5M Ridge-to-Reef Programme Signed with the Green Climate Fund

Summary

In July 2026, Fiji and the FAO signed a \$52.5M, seven-year Green Climate Fund project to restore over 80,000 ha of forest/agricultural land and protect 90,000+ ha of coastal ecosystems, targeting ~6 Mt CO₂e removed over 20 years and resilience benefits for 340,000+ people.
