

# Fundación Chile — Public-Private Technology Transfer for the Salmon Industry

## Summary

Chile's 1976 public-private technology-transfer institute imported and adapted salmon-farming technology for domestic firms; by 1991 the industry had grown to 56 companies and ~1,000 farms, and by 2000 Chile had overtaken Scotland as the world's second-largest salmon producer.
