Summary

Ghana's national Girls-in-ICT programme ran a 10-day AI, machine-learning, big-data and cybersecurity bootcamp for 50 female university students at the Kofi Annan ICT Centre, part of a wider rollout reaching thousands of girls, 60%+ with no prior computer experience.
