Summary

Ghana's national Girls-in-ICT programme runs regional coding, cybersecurity and mentorship boot camps for school-age girls, jointly funded by government and MTN. Roughly 14,000 girls trained since 2017, though Ghana's Parliament has called for stronger outcome monitoring.
