

GlobalConsent — Web-Based Sexual-Violence Prevention Trial for University Men in Hanoi

Summary

A randomised trial of 793 university men in Hanoi found GlobalConsent, a six-module web-based programme with a local drama series, curbed sexually violent behaviour and increased bystander action versus a control programme.
