

Greece's Three-Cycle Digital Accessibility Monitoring (2021–2024) — a Persistent 90% Accessibility-Statement Gap

Summary

Greece's Ministry of Digital Governance compared three EU-mandated monitoring cycles (2021–2024) covering 404 to 451 public-sector sites and apps. Up to 90% lacked a valid accessibility statement in every cycle, while PDF checks and audit scope expanded year on year.
