

Green Tripartite Agreement — National Peatland Rewetting Scheme (Denmark)

Summary

Denmark's June 2024 Green Tripartite Agreement commits a ~DKK 40bn (EUR 5.4bn) Green Land Fund to voluntarily rewet 140,000 ha of drained agricultural peatland by 2030, backed by a 2027 nitrogen-regulation backstop if uptake falls short.
