Summary

Since 2011, Helsinki, Espoo, Vantaa and Kauniainen have jointly run a shared open-data service now covering about 1,000 datasets on a €60,000/year joint budget; the City of Helsinki credits it with 1–2% budget savings and dozens of citizen-built apps.
