Summary

Since 2021, Instant Network Schools has expanded from one refugee settlement to 15+ Kolibri-powered offline learning centres across Nampula Province, reaching 52,000+ students and 1,266 teachers by 2023, with a 2023 Akelius pilot where 96% wanted to continue.
