

Internet Brasil – Free Mobile Broadband Chips for Low-Income Students

Summary

Brazil's Ministry of Communications distributes free 20 GB/month e-SIM chips to low-income students (CadÚnico). By end-2024, 159,449 students across 944 schools in 8 states received chips; 99% report using them for schoolwork.
