Summary

Piloted in Kigali in 2009, Isange One Stop Centre co-locates medical care, forensic exams, police and legal support, and counselling for GBV survivors in one visit. Expanded to 23 centres by 2016, it served over 49,000 survivors between 2015 and 2018.
