

Joint-Spousal Land Certification under Burundi's Landscape Restoration and Resilience Project (PRRPB)

Summary

Burundi's World Bank-funded PRRPB land-certification programme registered rural plots in both spouses' names, delivering 93,000+ certificates -- nearly seven times the 14,000 target -- with ~70% including women's names, giving many wives legal land rights for the first time.
