

Jordan's Government Websites Guidelines 2022 — From a 325-Violation Diagnostic to a WCAG 2.1 Mandate for Every Ministry Site

Summary

After a 2019 audit of Jordan's national portal found 325 accessibility problems and 1,535 unresolved warnings, ministry MoDEE issued Government Websites Guidelines mandating WCAG 2.1-based accessibility for every ministry site, revised to v2.0 in 2022.
