Summary

World Bank-financed KIIDP (2008-2021, \$33.6M then \$183.7M) gave 1.3M+ Kampala residents road access, beating its target -- but a drainage sub-project lost funding after unresolved resettlement, and an Inspection Panel complaint needed 18 months of mediation.
