Summary

A US\$3.65M GEF/World Bank grant (Project P170846) funds Dominica to rehabilitate trails in three national parks — Cabrits, Morne Trois Pitons (UNESCO) and Morne Diablotin — plus the Waitukubuli Trail, channelling ecotourism revenue into biodiversity management.
