

Liste Zébrée: Gender-Alternation Candidate Lists for Local Elections

Gender Equality · Good practice · Central African Republic

Quality score: 85/100

Evidence strength: Quasi-experimental

Summary

CAR's 2016 law set a 35% women-candidate quota. "Zebra list" alternation lifted local council representation to 45-53%, versus 12.5% of national candidates and 11.4% of Assembly seats in the 2025 elections.
