

# Lithuania's First Accessibility Monitoring Cycle — 128 of 131 Government Sites Non-Compliant, Then Tracked to Remediation

## Summary

Lithuania's first EU accessibility monitoring cycle found shortcomings on 128 of 131 tested government sites and full compliance on only 2 of 18 mobile apps — rising to 10 of 18 after a remediation deadline, showing structured follow-up drives real fixes.
