Summary

Mauritius's Higher Education Commission published national AI governance guidelines in June 2025, grounded in the GDPR-aligned Data Protection Act 2017, recommending AI Ethics & Risk-Audit committees — after a baseline survey found 65% of institutions had no formal AI policy.
