Summary

Mexico's federal government is building a National Care System to redistribute unpaid care work, disproportionately done by women (3 in 4 caregivers). By October 2025 its SIDEKU platform had mapped 118,618 public care centres, backed by a budget equal to 1.2% of GDP.
