Kenya's government, Microsoft and Pathways Technologies run a train-the-trainer AI skilling programme for TVET instructors and students, targeting 100,000 trained by May 2025 across 16+ pilot sites, later expanded to coastal counties via the Stanbic Kenya Foundation.
