In October 2025, Girls in ICT Rwanda and the Smart Africa Alliance brought 11 finalists aged 13-21 from 11 African countries to Kigali to build AI prototypes for local problems, including a maternal-health chatbot, ahead of a pitch at the Transform Africa Summit.
