

National AI Education Pilot — Iceland Rolls Out Claude and Gemini for Teachers

Evidence strength: Descriptive / self-reported

Summary

Iceland's education directorate and teachers' union gave ~7% of the country's teachers (~300 primary/lower-secondary, ~260 upper-secondary) free access to Claude and Gemini in a 6-month pilot — more modest than Anthropic's 'nationwide' framing, per an independent union check.
