Summary

Europe's first therapeutic treatment centre for IPV perpetrators (Oslo, 1987), ATV now operates 15 offices in Norway. An NKVTS outcome study documents reduction in partner violence 1.5 years post-treatment; model adopted in Sweden, Iceland and Denmark.
