

Ogoni Women's Mangrove Reforestation — Lokiaka Community Development Centre (Bodo Creek, Nigeria)

Summary

Since 2018, Lokiaka Community Development Centre has trained ~300 Ogoni women in four Niger Delta communities who planted 2.6 million mangroves in oil-damaged Bodo Creek, Yaataa and Teenama swamps, self-reporting 80-96% survival toward 5 million more by 2030.
