

Oman's Digitalisation of Curricula — Ministry-Led AI Teacher Training and Interactive Textbooks with UNESCO and BP Oman

Summary

Oman's Ministry of Education, with UNESCO since 2022 and BP Oman on curriculum digitalisation, had trained nearly 3,300 educators in AI by January 2025; a survey of 243 teachers and 266 students found a 20% cut in admin burden and 65% higher engagement.
