

One Guyana Digital — Guyana-Canada Partnership Trains Youth as AI-Assisted Full-Stack Developers

Summary

Guyana and Canada fund GOAL and Toronto Metropolitan University to train 2,000 young Guyanese as full-stack developers using AI-assisted coding tools; the first 365-strong cohort graduated in Dec 2024, with 60% women and 20% Indigenous participants nationwide.
