

Opportunities Without Borders - Pro Mujer's Economic Inclusion Programme for Venezuelan Migrant Women in Colombia

Summary

Facing 29.2% unemployment among Venezuelan migrant women in Colombia (vs 14.9% for men), Pro Mujer's USAID/OSF-backed programme capitalised 566 women's businesses and helped 1,142 reach formal employment across 9 cities in its first year (2022-2023).
