

Panama's Law 15 Web-Accessibility Mandate Meets a 14,571-Error Reality Check

Summary

Panama's 2016 Law 15 requires accessible public-sector websites, but a 2018 University of Panama audit of 46 institutional and corporate sites found 14,571 WCAG 2.0 errors. ANTAI and SENADIS then agreed to fold accessibility checks into monthly transparency monitoring.
